## Local Government Resident Representation in Canada

The overwhelming majority of Municipalities in British Columbia use an "at-large" election system to elect mayors and councillors. The only municipality in B.C. that uses electoral districts is the District of Lake Country (north of Kelowna). Electors there elect 4 councillors from specific districts and two councillors "at-large". Section 36.1(2) of the BC Local Government Act gives municipalities the authority to create constituencies through a by-law.
Ward (or District) council representation systems, and/or combinations of same are widely used across the rest of Canada.
The are several variences of Ward/District systems used by Canadian municipalities and they are used by both large and
small municipalities.

The main variances are:

1) Wards (Districts) with one Councillor elected in each ward.
2) Wards (Districts) with more than one Councillor elected in each (usually two per Ward)
3) Ward and at-large; a combination of one council member elected in each ward with more than 1 councillor(s) elected "at large"
4) Ward and at-large; a combination of more than one council member elected in each ward with more than 1 councillor elected "at-large"

Various papers have been written and studies done on the stenghts and weaknesses of both the "at-large" and ward election methods of electing councillors and is beyond the scope of this document.

In Greater Victoria, the two largest municipalities elect councillors "at-large". In the City of Victoria, Council assign Councillors to represent Neighbourhood associations, however Councillors are not specifically accountable to the neighbourhood they represent. In Saanich, Councillors are assigned to represent specific Municipal Departments, e.g. a resident with an issue with Planning would be referred to the Councillor responsible to liase with the Planning Department.
