When I lived in Perth, Australia, the affordable-housing policy implemented by the government stated that all initiatives had to be equally spread across all municipalities. This kept ghettos from forming, unlike what we are starting to see in Victoria (Quadra and Johnson and Burnside-Ellice Street corridors). I'm sure not all people seeking affordable housing want to live in downtown Victoria, Fairfield, Fernwood or Vic West.

Where are the other municipal strategies? To what extent is there an affordable-housing strategy across the CRD?

Our lack of amalgamation means we will have a disorganized and incohesive solution to this problem.
